Dear Participant,

As you know, the refereed proceedings of the conference will be published as special issues of The Ramanujan Journal. The deadline for submission (firm) for these special issues is June 30, 2009.

Please go to the Ramanujan Journal website (Springer) and submit the paper online. Please include a line of dedication at the top such as

"Dedicated to George Andrews for his 70-th birthday"

so that we can identify this as a paper scheduled for these special issues. After submission, please send a pdf file of the paper to Alladi ([alladik@math.ufl.edu](mailto:alladik@math.ufl.edu)) for our records.

You may submit a regular research paper with new results and their proofs, or a survey. The survey should not just be an account of your work, but a good survey of the area or subarea, with ample references. You may submit a joint paper. Your paper need not be on the talk you gave at the conference (in case you gave a talk), but related to the area/topic of your talk. All papers will be refereed as per journal standards.

Once the paper is accepted, it is Springer's policy to publish the paper on Online First without much delay. This will not have a volume assigned nor will there be page numbers within such a volume. After all papers received (by June 30, 2009) are refereed/accepted, we will compile them to get the special issues printed from the Online First articles.

In order to help with the production, please have the following when you submit the papers:

- a) An abstract,
- b) A list of key words, and
- c) Subject Classification Numbers - Primary (essential)  
Secondary (optional)

Soon after the Ramanujan Journal special issues are printed, a hard copy version of these issues will be published in the book series Developments in Mathematics (Springer) so that those who do not subscribe to the journal and wish to have a copy of these proceedings can purchase the book. Springer has offered a 40% discount on the list price of the book

to all participants of CA2008 (even those who may not contribute a paper). We need to have a good idea of the number of orders of the book that we would get from the participants to help set up the price. The list price is projected around \$125, and so the discounted price for the participants is expected to be around \$75. Please let us know by Jan 31, 2009, whether you intend to purchase the book.

We look forward to your contribution to the Proceedings and purchase of the volume.
