

## **Criminal Justice Faculty**

The College of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences invites nominations or applications for a nine-month, tenure track faculty position for the Criminal Justice and Social Work Department to begin August 2012. To be considered, candidates must provide evidence of effective teaching methods and productive scholarship in their respective fields. Qualified candidates will be expected to engage in scholarly activities in keeping with the **Boyer Model of Scholarship** as is appropriate to the application and receipt of tenure and promotion at Gannon. Appropriate terminal degrees are required and must be completed prior to the beginning of the fall semester. Ideally, candidates will have experience using course management systems for the purposes of instruction and advising.

Requirements include an earned doctorate in Criminal Justice/Sociology with a concentration in Criminal Justice or a related field (J.D. or L.L.B. alone is not a sufficient terminal degree). Candidates will teach 12 credits per semester in the full spectrum of Criminal Justice undergraduate core courses and electives and will contribute to the development of the Criminal Justice elective curriculum. Preference will be given to candidates whose specialty areas are law enforcement and/or courts. Well qualified candidates will also have familiarity with the use of technology in the classroom and the use of course management systems, excellent computing skills, and a well-designed and focused research agenda. It is highly recommended and preferred that candidates have experience in the development and delivery of alternative teaching strategies (online and hybrid courses); one year of full-time or part-time teaching experience, preferably in a college setting, teaching Criminal Justice or courses from a closely aligned discipline.
