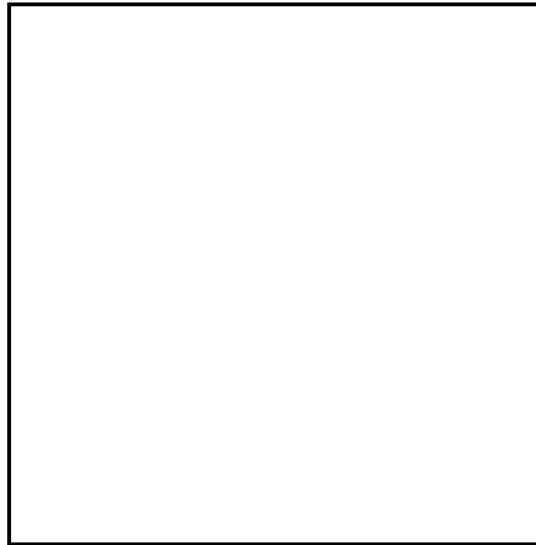

This memorandum is being prepared to set forth additional developments in this case which involves shakedown extortion activities of a gang preying on homosexuals throughout the United States.

To date, four subjects have been arrested by the Bureau in connection with the extortion of three victims using the homosexual extortion scheme. In addition, warrants have been obtained for three subjects in another extortion scheme.

[redacted] and has furnished information to our Chicago, New York and Charlotte Offices. It is to be noted [redacted] and has knowledge of so many of these extortion schemes that he could not possibly recall all of them.

According to [redacted] John Pyne, a Chicago police officer on leave of absence, is the "big man" in the gang and receives ten per cent of all monies extorted. We are endeavoring to develop information to corroborate [redacted] statement pointing toward the arrest of Pyne. [redacted] also described [redacted] one of the subjects arrested by the Bureau.

He advised there were other groups operating similar schemes throughout the United States. In this connection, the District Attorney's Office in New York City is presently investigating such a group and to date have arrested over eighteen individuals.

In addition to the victims in cases presently under Federal prosecution, [redacted] named additional victims among whom are such prominent individuals as Congressman [redacted] not further identified; [redacted] unknown Internal Revenue Service employee; [redacted] and entertainers [redacted] guitar player with [redacted]

In addition, [redacted] stated one of former President John F. Kennedy's cabinet members* had a homosexual affair with [redacted] one of the subjects arrested by the Bureau in this case. [redacted]

Re New York airtel to Bureau, 4/5/66.

Review of Philadelphia indices failed to reflect any current activities on the part of the individuals set forth in referenced airtel as subjects or suspects. Survey of current cases is still in progress by the Philadelphia Division in an attempt to locate instance possibly involving the unknown subjects.

On 4/11/66, Detective Sergeant ROBERT SMITH and Detective JOHN FRYE, Intelligence Division, Philadelphia Police, which division handles confidence racket type investigations, caused a review of the records of their departments and failed to locate any complaint in recent years possibly involving any of the subjects with the exception of ELWOOD LEE HAMMOCK. Sergeant SMITH pointed out that investigation at that time was made in

cooperation with the Metropolitan Police of Washington, D.C., concerning the confidence type racket operation by HAMMOCK at that time. Sergeant SMITH indicated the majority of confidence games of interstate nature are usually reported to the U.S. Attorney's office rather than the Police Department.

Philadelphia File 46-5006 entitled, "WILLIAM JOSEPH BURKE, aka; ET AL; [REDACTED] - VICTIM; [REDACTED] VICTIM; ITAR - EXTORTION," OO:Chicago, reflects that on 5/19/65 the detectives of the Philadelphia County District Attorney's office conducted an investigation as a result of a complaint from [REDACTED] Philadelphia.

This complaint indicated that [REDACTED] Pa., was a victim of an attempt to blackmail at 2 p.m. on 5/14/65. The complainant stated on 5/14/65, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was contacted by an unidentified white male who attempted to blackmail him outside the premises at his place of employment. At an interview by the District Attorney's office, [REDACTED] advised he had been arrested in [REDACTED] on a sodomy charge and was subsequently found not guilty in local court.

On 5/14/65, at approximately 2 p.m., while seated at his desk, he was approached by the above mentioned unknown white male who displayed a small leather folder and what appeared to be a metal badge. He represented himself as a Philadelphia detective. The unidentified man advised [REDACTED] had been under investigation for the past two weeks and unless [REDACTED] could come up with a substantial amount of money, he most likely would be in jail tonight. The man represented himself to be a detective, said he had been involved in a magistrate's investigation brought up to date from the past, and requested that "additional payoff must be made at this time."

He inquired regarding [REDACTED] bank account, and [REDACTED] indicated he had \$700 or \$800 in cash in the bank and possibly three or four \$500 bonds at home. [REDACTED] indicated that he would obtain money from the bank as soon as he was relieved of his duties at his office. Arrangements were made to meet in center city around 4 p.m., that day.

After the unknown subject left, [redacted] who persuaded him to call the police. Later the same date, the unknown subject called [redacted] who had worked out a plan with detectives, and [redacted] instructed the unknown subject to appear at his office for collection. b6 b7C

The unknown subject was arrested at 5 p.m., the same day in [redacted] Philadelphia. The individual identified himself as [redacted] Chicago, Ill. At the time of arrest he had three \$100 bills and two \$20.00 bills. He had identified himself as being associated with Associated Press, 188 West Rand Street, Chicago, Ill., as a free lance news reporter. Contact with Associated Press indicated this individual was unknown to them. Also in [redacted] possession was automobile Operator's License for the State of Illinois indicating also the above address. Said license was reportedly issued by the State of Illinois 4/4/63 to expire 4/8/66. b6 b7C

On 5/24/65, he was held under \$500 bail for court charge of impersonating a police officer and attempted extortion. Investigation determined that [redacted] was wanted as a parole violator by the New York State Division of Parole under the name of [redacted]. He was re-charged on 5/24/65 as a fugitive from other jurisdiction and held for New York authorities.

Philadelphia Police Report #70696, dated 5/24/65, reflects that on this date [redacted] Pa., advised officers of the Special Investigations Squad that the following incident took place in Atlantic City, N.J., in 9/63. b6 b7C

He indicated that in 9/63 while in Atlantic City, N.J. at an hotel an individual identified himself as Detective [redacted] of the Atlantic City Police Department, Fraud Squad. He advised he had conducted some investigation regarding [redacted] through his name and address and let him go; however, on 9/10/63 a man identifying himself as Detective [redacted] appeared at [redacted] residence with an official looking document and indicated charges would be placed against [redacted] however, he could get [redacted] out of this problem for \$2,500. [redacted] said he did not have the money. b6 b7C

[redacted] indicated during his conversation with "Detective [redacted]" advised that if he could get \$1,250 that day he could wait until 9/14/63 for the remainder. b6 b7C

During this time, unknown subject was in contact with the Atlantic City District Attorney's office and was overheard to say, "Let me handle this my way. I'll get \$1,250 today and the rest later." [redacted] told [redacted] he could get \$1,000 from a bank at 16th and Chestnut Streets, Philadelphia. [redacted] insisted on \$1,250. [redacted] withdrew \$1,250, put it in a bank envelope, and went to a parked car in front of the Warwick Hotel, Philadelphia. He gave the money to [redacted] at which time [redacted] stated [redacted] should meet him in front of the Haddon Hall Hotel on the boardwalk in Atlantic City on 9/14/63.
